Cash-Based Programming Specialists



General description

Cash-Based Programming Specialists are deployed to support the assessment, design, set-up, implementation, monitoring, and reporting of high quality, timely and accountable cash-based programming on behalf of IDPs or refugees, and their host communities. Leading or supporting inter-agency coordination of cash-based interventions may also represent a core function.

Required cash-based programming specialist support may be multi-purpose and basic needs-oriented, or sector-specific. It will be based on robust modality selection (across cash, vouchers and cash for work – alone, or in combination with other assistance modalities such as in-kind assistance, service provision or infrastructure); grounded in targeted humanitarian market assessment and analysis; and delivered through the most appropriate transfer mechanisms and payment systems depending on the context.

Within the Cash-Based Programming Specialists job cluster, three specific profiles are identified and sought:

- Cash-Based Programming Technical Specialist
- Cash-Based Programming Coordinator
- Cash-Based Programming Operations Specialist

A number of core competences – supported/evidenced and demonstrated by a candidate's relevant experience – are required across the three profiles; in addition are certain required competences specific to each individual role.

Cash-Based Programming Specialists will primarily, but not exclusively, be deployed to UNHCR, WFP, OCHA & FAO.

Required qualifications

- Professional technical experience evidencing and demonstrating the above-mentioned core competences
- A minimum of 3 years international humanitarian field experience, with a focus on cash-based programming
- Relevant educational background and knowledge of the international humanitarian system in general, and specifically of the UN
- Knowledge and understanding of the complexity related to refugee and IDP situations
- Proficiency in one (preferable two) UN languages. English is obligatory, while French or Arabic are an advantage.
